

Introduction and Method

Introduction

Members of the Emory Prevention Research (EPRC) Community Advisory Board (CAB) asked the EPRC to conduct a brief needs assessment in southwest Georgia to help understand the reasons for low COVID-19 vaccine acceptance among selected groups, as well as lower than desired uptake in the region. A few key demographic groups of interest were African Americans/Blacks, Whites who identify as politically conservative, adults of childbearing age, and rural residents.

The EPRC, as a part of the national Prevention Research Centers Program, will be receiving supplemental funding to identify key behavioral insights that will inform effective solutions to increase COVID-19 vaccine confidence, and ultimately uptake. This formative work serves the dual purposes of informing the PRC-funded work and providing useful data for community partners.

Method

We reviewed similar surveys shared by colleagues or that were publicly available to create the survey. The survey was developed with CAB member input and received their final approval. It includes questions about participant and household member COVID-19 diagnosis, participant vaccination status and that of friends/family, reasons for getting the vaccine if vaccinated, reasons for not wanting the vaccine, factors that might support vaccination uptake, additional information about the vaccine that would be helpful, trusted sources of information about COVID-19, political affiliation, and demographics. CAB members promoted the online survey through their organizations' social media pages (Facebook, primarily) and email listservs. The survey was administered in Qualtrics, a secure online data collection platform, from 3/29/21-4/23/21. A large number of responses were received, with many from outside of the region and/or clearly fake. After careful screening, 138 participants are included in the current report. Each participant received a \$10 gift card of their choice to Amazon.com or Walmart.

At the end of the survey, participants were asked to provide their name, phone number, and preferred days/times to be reached if they were interested in participating in a follow-up interview. We hope to interview approximately 30 people, especially those who fall in the key demographic groups and are not yet vaccinated.

This report presents the data from most survey questions (excluding only the open-ended questions/ fields) for the overall sample, and selected data among African Americans; White participants who identify as conservative, independent, or libertarian; and among adults ages 18-45 (as a broad classification of childbearing age).
